## Community Announcements and Enhancements

#### Board of Directors Meetings

Regular board of directors' meetings are held the *last Wednesday* of each month. #### • The Pima Pedestrian Gate

HIP HIP HOORAY! After a long and challenging journey, the Board is delighted to report the Pima pedestrian gate is working properly. After an in-depth discussion, including the poor performance over the past year with the current gate vendor *AAA Smart Business*, the Board unanimously approved the termination of their contract.

The Board also approved a new gate vendor contract with *iCan Access and Video*. The new gate vendor comes recommended by Property Manager, Denny Batchik, who is familiar with the company and their business practices. The annual cost will be roughly equivalent to the amount paid to the previous gate vendor.

#### Thompson Peak Park Dog Park Update

A three-and-one-half-acre dog park consisting of separate fenced and gated areas is expected to begin construction in the fall 2024. The project will include:

- Three fenced cells or play areas for dogs
- Canopies, benches, water fountains and pet waste disposal stations
- A footbridge to connect the off-leash area to existing park amenities
- Additional parking along Hayden Road
- A new restroom building
- Public Art

#### The Maintenance Committee

Roof Tile and Mud Pot Replacement – Based on the drone overview inspection of the building roofs, numerous damaged tiles and mud pots were identified. The Board approved the *Red Mountain* 



*Roofing* proposal to perform repairs. These repairs are a proactive approach to extend the life of the roofs. *Roof Replacement* is a major planned project. See *The Reserve Study* on the website in the protected *MEMBERS* section, *Current Year*.

Stucco Repair – Residents can contact the Maintenance Committee with any stucco damage identified outside their units and common areas. The Committee is aware of the ongoing need to repair stucco deterioration throughout the community. Weather permitting, repairs will continue throughout the summer months.

Road Resurfacing – The 4<sup>th</sup> Quarter of 2024 is the projected time frame for the road resurfacing project. Stay tuned, more information on this very important maintenance item will be forthcoming.

Treasurers Report - The May 2024 report to the Board, covering April highlights, is located on the *Tesoro* website, under the *MEMBERS* tab, *Current Year*, *Monthly Meeting Minutes*.



Assessment Income – 3% over budget due to collection of past due assessments.

Operating Expenses - Over budget due to income tax payment in April (budgeted for May) and higher than planned general and pool maintenance expenses.

Operating Cash – Strong! We have almost two months of operating expenses in cash. Our balance will grow in May without the large insurance or income tax expenses paid in April.

Reserve Fund Interest - We earned \$1,613 in interest on our CD investments. YTD total \$30,129.

Looking Forward 2024 - Capital Contribution Assessments. If all units currently for sale close at the currently offered prices, the Finance Committee projects \$11,960 in contributions added to our reserve fund.

### **Healthy Living - Be Heat Ready**

Maricopa County would like to remind you to stay safe during extreme Arizona heat. An excessive heat warning is issued by the *National Weather Service* when there is a *High* or *Very High Heat Risk*. During these episodes it is best to remain indoors, drink plenty of water, avoid drinks with caffeine and strenuous work, protect face and head with a hat, and wear sunscreen. Know the signs of heat-related illness and what to do.

- *Heat Cramps* are muscle pains or spasms in stomach, arms and legs.
  - o *Take Action* go to a cooler location, remove excess clothing, sip cool sports drinks, seek medical help if cramps last longer than one hour.
- *Heat Stroke* Extremely high body temperature, greater than 103 degrees, red, hot, dry skin, no sweating, dizziness, confusion or unconsciousness.
  - o *Take Action* Call 911 or get the person to a hospital immediately.

## Monsoon Season - Haboob



The National Weather Service has established that monsoon season begins June 15th and ends September 30th. Monsoon is the time of year when the winds shift causing a reversal in weather patterns in the southwest. The storms can range from blowing dust to severe thunderstorms and lightning. Often the more severe storms begin with the "haboob" which are extensive walls of dust that move across the Valley, and with the dust comes wind, usually followed by heavy rain.

Monsoon storms can produce dusty and hazardous conditions, wind damage and flooding. If you are driving and see the wall of blowing dirt, get to a safe place as soon as possible. Due to the dry conditions and minimal rainfall, the ground has a difficult time absorbing the intense rapid rainfall during the monsoon. Desert washes fill quickly, and entire streets may flood. During heavy rains, residents should avoid areas where the water crosses the road.
